
Historically, many have turned to rental trucks for DIY moves. But as we head into peak moving season, people have begun to rethink how to face this historically complicated and challenging process.


Whether people are getting ready for their next big move, or getting rid of items they can't take with them, this month was jam-packed with shipping.




MOST HIPSTER SHIPMENT

LONGEST DISTANCE SHIPPED



A 2008 22-foot SeaSwirl Striper boat was shipped the longest distance of any item in 2017, traveling over 5,000 miles in 12 days from Miami to Anchorage, Alaska.


